

NYLARNet DATA BRIEF: Latinos in New York State by County: 1990 – 2008

As the data below confirms, since 1990 the New York State Latino population has increasingly spread from urban to suburban environments throughout southern New York surrounding New York City. Though the majority of the Latino population remains concentrated within the boroughs, the suburban counties' populations have more than doubled in less than 20 years. Latino population has continued to rise steadily in all localities excluding Manhattan which, though still up from 1990, shows a decline from 2000 to the present.
